About Fulton High School

Fulton High School opened in 1951 as one of Tennessee's first comprehensive high schools, combining a complete academic curriculum with a full vocational program. Fulton is located in historic North Knoxville just 5 minutes from the University of Tennessee campus. The school is named for noted industrialist and inventor Weston M. Fulton. Fulton has developed a reputation for turning out graduates who have followed the school motto "enter to learn- go forth to serve." A tradition of outstanding athletic teams has been born at the school. Famous former Falcons include College Football hall of famer and former Dallas Cowboy D.D. Lewis, UT

basketball All-American Bill Justus, former Vol linebacker Jackie Walker, and four-sport letter winner Ron Widby. Fulton's destiny was almost sealed in 1992 when the Knox Co. School Board voted to close the school, but strong protests by alumni and supporters helped to reverse the decision. The Falcons clinched their first state championship in any sport in 2003 defeating Covington for the class 3A football title. Fulton began their title defense on a rocky note in 2004, losing 2 of their first 4 games, but showed constant improvement throughout the season. The Falcons hit their stride in the playoffs, advancing to their 3rd consecutive BlueCross Bowl. Fulton's 2nd state championship was sewn up after a 34-6 defeat of Greenbrier.

Coach Buck Coatney

Fulton High School's 26-7 win over Austin-East on August 25th was a milestone victory for Head Football Coach Buck Coatney. The Falcons gave Coatney his 100th coaching victory as FHS head coach. This is an amazing feat, considering that when Coatney was hired in 1992, Fulton was slated to be closed. Coatney's job looked to be a temporary one. Interest in football was slipping at the school, as many players moved to other schools due to the proposed closing. The 1992 team suffered through a 1-9 season, but the lone win was an overtime victory over West. The Fulton program improved throughout the early 90s. The Falcons made their first of 13 consecutive playoff appearances under Coatney in 1993. By the year 2000, Fulton had re-established

itself as a football power in the Knoxville area. In 2002, Coatney led the Falcons to their first undefeated regular season since 1974, ending the season at the BlueCross Bowl. Coatney became the first-ever coach in Knoxville to lead his team to back-to-back state football championships in 2003 and 2004.

Coatney's roots are colored maroon and white, as his father John captained Fulton's 1959 team. Coatney was known as a hard-nosed linebacker and tight end on the Falcon teams of the late 70s. He was named to the all-state team and the *Knoxville Journal* defensive player of the year, as he led Fulton to a region championship in 1979. Coatney earned Honorable-Mention All-American honors at Furman University. He began his coaching career at Furman as a graduate assistant. After leaving Furman, Coatney spent two years as an assistant coach at Middlesburg High School in Florida. He returned to Fulton in 1987, where he served as Defensive Coordinator. He was named Fulton's 11th head coach in 1992. Coatney is the only football coach to win three consecutive KFL/PrepXtra Coach of the year honors (2002-2004). For his work in 2004, Coatney was named state coach of the year by the Tennessee Sportswriters Association, and the Tennessee Titans.

Last Week- FHS 36 Carter 8

In conditions better suited for a tractor pull, the Fulton Falcons handed the Carter Hornets their second loss of the year in a playoff matchup at Eblen Field. Fulton's 36-8 victory meant that the Falcons outscored the Hornets 84-11 in the teams' two meetings. The poor conditions hampered both teams in the first half, as both squads squandered scoring opportunities. Fulton had an 8-0 lead at the break thanks to a 31-yard run by Dennis Rogan in the first quarter. Carter's best scoring opportunity in the first half ended on a Derek Humphrey interception of a Mark Allen Bounds pass deep in Fulton territory. Fulton gained much-needed breathing room in the third quarter as QB Jonathan Blair hit JaMichael Mathis on the sideline for a 45-yard scoring strike to open the half. Rogan was a difference maker in the second half for Fulton. The UT commitment added two more scoring runs in the third quarter to put away Carter. Rogan's third score, a 79-yard jaunt, may have been one of the finest of his career. Carter DB Zach Gorman had an angle on Rogan, but the senior turned on the jets in the mud and outran the defender into the end zone. The score silenced the partisan Hornet crowd. Rogan

rushed for a season best 265 yards. Maurice Stinson closed the scoring for Fulton on a 5-yard run. The Hornets running game was held to minus-11 yards on the night, but Carter completed 11 passes for 182 yards. Brandon Winters led the Fulton defense with 8 stops.

Inside the Numbers

The Fulton defense surrendered a season high 13 first downs to Carter last week, and a season high 182 passing yards. ... The Fulton offense set a season high last week with 20 first downs. ... Fulton's two pass completions last week set a season low, but both passes from Jonathan Blair were crucial to the victory. Blair hit JaMichael Mathis on a 45-yard TD, and Ken Tyson on a 42-yard strike that set up Fulton's 3rd TD. ... Dennis Rogan's 265 yards last week against Carter was his best performance of the season. ... The Falcons are outscoring opponents 456-100 on the year, and 120-7 in the first quarter. ... Despite using 4 different QB's this season, Fulton out gains opponents by 27.1 yards per game through the air. ... Fulton has a +14 advantage in turnover margin this season. The Falcons have forced 31 turnovers, while only giving away 17 turnovers. ... Fulton has converted on 12 of 36 4th down conversions, while allowing opponents to convert 10 of 31 4th downs.

Falcons To Honor Kristi Walker

The Fulton High Family lost both a family member and a friend this spring with the passing of Kristi Black Walker. Kristi, the daughter of Coach Bob Black and Sister of Coach Rob Black, passed away on May 4, 2006 after a battle with cancer. Kristi was a 1989 graduate of Fulton, and was a member of the cheerleading squad. She was an employee of Knox Co. schools in the employee benefits department. Kristi was one of Fulton's most passionate fans. She was the heart of the Falcon cheering section, often bringing signs and cheering at the top of her lungs. Kristi also was a fixture on the coacht.com message boards, keeping opposing fans in check as screen name kwalker4. To honor her memory, the Fulton football team will have a special logo on the backs of their helmets featuring the initials "KW." Additionally, Coach

Coatney announced that Fulton's new black jerseys are dedicated to Kristi. Any memorials can be sent to the Walker Children Trust Fund, c/o Knoxville Teachers Federal Credit Union, 104 East Fourth Avenue, Knoxville, TN 37917. The *News-Sentinel* devoted part of last week's PrepXtra section to Kristi's story.

Fulton vs Catholic- The Series

Fulton and Catholic will meet tonight for the fourth time in school history. Fulton won the first meeting last year 38-9, and lost the playoff rematch 21-20. Catholic leads the all-time series 2-1 after the Irish defeated Fulton 27-14 earlier this year. Despite the fact that for many years Fulton and Catholic were located near to each other, the schools do share a few similarities. From 1951-1964 Fulton played its home games on Evans-Collins Field, the same field that Catholic played on when the school was located on Magnolia. In 1983 Catholic hosted the Shamrock Bowl, a post-season doubleheader. The Falcons won their Shamrock Bowl game over Carter by the score of 10-7.

Fulton vs. Private Schools

Several private schools made their way into Division I beginning with the 2005 season. Fulton has faced one other private school this season. The Falcons won their first private school match-up of the year defeating Boyd-Buchanan 40-6 in Chattanooga. Boyd-Buchanan went on to win Region 3-2A. The Falcons have only had nine meetings with private schools, dating back to the 1974 playoffs. Fulton defeated McCallie 21-7 in the state semi-final at Neyland Stadium, and lost to Father Ryan 29-28 in the finals. Fulton's last meeting prior to the 2005 Boyd-Buchanan game with a private school came in 1992 when Chad Pennington led Webb to a 27-7 victory. FHS holds a 5-4 advantage in games against private schools.

Region 2-3A Playoff Rematches

Since 2001, region 2-3A has sent a team to the BlueCross Bowl every year, and is rated as one of the toughest regions in the state. Winning the region is not necessarily an indicator that the team is going to win the state. No team that has won region 2-3A since 2001 has won the state championship. Region champions must face their regional brethren in playoff rematches. During this period, teams that have won the regular season match-ups hold only a 3-7 record in the playoff rematch. Anderson Co. defeated Fulton twice in 2001 before being upset by A-E in the third round. The Roadrunners defeated Anderson Co. twice

in 2003, and were upset in the third round by Fulton. This year, Catholic defeated A-E twice before facing Fulton tonight. The following chart details all region 2-3A match-ups since 2001.

Fulton in Season Rematch Games

Tonight will be the 15th time that Fulton has faced a team two times during the same season. The Falcons are 7-7 in rematch games. Fulton's first rematch game came in 1965. Fulton defeated Central 15-7 in regular season action, but drew the Bobcats in the post-season Optimist Bowl. Central won the rematch 7-0. Seymour is Fulton's most common rematch opponent, as the Falcons and Eagles have played twice in a season on five occasions. This is the second consecutive week that Fulton has faced a regular season opponent in the play-offs. Fulton defeated Carter 48-3 in the regular season, and 36-8 last week.

Playoff Streak Longest in Knox

The Fulton Falcons are the #2 seed from Region 2-3A in the TSSAA playoffs that begin last week. It marks the Falcons' 14th consecutive playoff trip. This is the longest playoff streak in Knox Co. The streak began in 1993, as Fulton upset Happy Valley 37-8 in the first round. During the streak, Fulton has compiled a record of 21-11 in playoff games with three championship appearances and two state championships. Fulton's playoff streak is longer than another local power, Maryville. Maryville's streak is only at 10 years. Fulton has made 17 playoff appearances, and holds an all-time play-off record of 24-14. The last two times that Fulton has been a #2 seed, the Falcons went on to win the state championship. Additionally, every time that Fulton has advanced past the 2nd round, they have played in the state championship game.

Rogan Mr. Football Nominee

Senior RB/DB Dennis Rogan added to his list of accomplishments on Wednesday by being named as a finalist for the American General Mr. Football Award for Class 3A backs for the second consecutive year. Rogan is the third Fulton player to be a finalist for the award. RB Jeff Mitchell was a finalist in 2001, and DE DeMarcus Stevens was a two-time finalist in 2002 and 2003. Rogan earned a nomination in 2005, with White House's Ricky Ladd winning the award. A Fulton player has never won the award. Also

nominated are Harrison Smith of Catholic and Randall Toney of Station Camp. Smith has rushed for 1203 yards and 19 TDs during the regular season. Toney led Station Camp to a 9-1 record by rushing for 1594 yards and 16 touchdowns. Rogan out gained both other candidates with 1752 yards and 29 TDs in the regular season. Winners will be announced at the Opryland Hotel on November 27.

Rogan has rushed for 2150 yards and 37 touchdowns on 262 carries this year. He also has 13 receptions for 135 yards and 2 TDs. Defensively; Rogan has recorded 42 tackles with 2 interceptions. Dennis ranks 1st on Fulton's all-time rushing yard list with 4743 yards. Rogan has shattered the FHS all-time rushing touchdown record, with 76 TD runs in his career. Rogan has scored 522 points in his career. A detailed description of Rogan's accomplishments can be found elsewhere in the game notes.

Rogan In Pursuit of History

Dennis Rogan became Fulton High school's all-time leading rusher on his first carry against Livingston Academy three weeks ago. Rogan eclipsed Jeff Mitchell's mark of 4145 yards on a 49-yard TD run in the first quarter. For his career, Rogan has school records in rushing yards (4743) and rushing TDs (76). Rogan has a chance tonight to move up in the state record books. Rogan has rushed for over 100 yards in each game since the Scott game last year. That streak of 19 consecutive 100-yard games gives him the second longest streak in state history passing Warren Co.'s Jeff Womack who had 18 consecutive 100-yard games in 1979-1980. The state record is 27 held by Tripp Tucker of University School of Jackson during 1997-1998. Dennis is 6 rushing TDs away from tying the state record for rushing TDs in a season. Rogan will need a strong playoff performance to have a chance to break Jeff Mitchell's FHS single season rushing yard mark of 2334 yards in 2001. He remains 184 yards away from that mark.

Falcons Earn 77th Shutout

Defense has been a hallmark of Fulton Football down through the years. Fulton's win over Livingston Academy set a defensive milestone for the Falcons. The 54-0 victory over Livingston was the 77th all-time shutout for Fulton football. Fulton has recorded at least one shutout for the last 10 seasons. Coach Coatney's teams have recorded a total of 21 shutouts since 1992. The Falcons recorded a record 6 shutouts during the 1974 season. West High has been blanked by the Falcons on 8 occasions, while Fulton has shutout Bearden 6 times, and Central 5 times. Fulton has shut out Carter twice, 32-0 in 1997, and 42-0 last year. Fulton's longest shutout streak came in the 2002 playoffs where FHS recorded three consecutive shutouts against Pigeon Forge, Seymour, and Gatlinburg Pittman.

Falcon Talk

Fulton will be wearing their retro white jerseys tonight that they wore from 2001-2003. The Falcons are 19-5 when wearing the retro white jerseys. Fulton is 2-0 in these jerseys this year, wearing them in muddy wins over Livingston Academy and Carter. Fulton also wore these jerseys in 2004 in a victory at Loudon. This is the same jersey that Fulton wore in the 2002 BlueCross Bowl. ... QB Jonathan Blair will be making his fifth career start tonight against Carter. Blair started last year's game with Alcoa, and tossed a TD pass to Ken Tyson. Blair passed for 123 yards and a TD in the first meeting against Carter. ... Fulton's 2006 opponents have a combined record of 82-53, while Catholic's opponents have a combined record of 63-68. ... Catholic's schedule is ranked by CoachT.com as the 46th toughest in 3A, while Fulton's is ranked 5th. ... Catholic has never advanced past the 3rd round of the TSSAA playoffs, and holds a 12-15 all-time playoff record in 16 playoff appearances. ... Fulton has scored on its opening drive in 5 games this year. ... Desmond and Derrick Humphrey became the first brothers to catch touchdown passes in the same game for the Falcons. Both of their catches came in the 4th quarter against Kingston. Terrence and Tyrone Cobb both had rushing TDs against Rutledge

in 2004. ... Fulton Senior OL/DL Mark Brown is currently featured in a PSA airing on local TV touting the free Flu Mist vaccine given to Knox. Co. students. Brown is featured along with "Dr. Bob" Overholt. He was also featured in a recent *News-Sentinel* feature. ... Region 2-3A has produced teams that have played in the BlueCross Bowl for the last five years, and four state champions. Livingston Academy was state champion in 2005 ... Fulton's 2006 schedule features six schools (A-E, Alcoa, Boyd-Buchanan, Tyner, Kingston, Livingston Academy) that have won a combined total of 14 state football championships ... Five teams on this year's schedule advanced to at least the third round of the playoffs last year (Alcoa, Boyd-Buchanan, Tyner, Catholic, Livingston Academy). ...
