About Fulton High School

Fulton High School opened in 1951 as one of Tennessee's first comprehensive high schools, combining a complete academic curriculum with a full vocational program. Fulton is located in historic North Knoxville just 5 minutes from the University of Tennessee campus. The school is named for noted industrialist and inventor Weston M. Fulton. Fulton has developed a reputation for turning out graduates who have followed the school motto "enter to learn- go forth to serve." A tradition of outstanding athletic teams has been born at the school. Famous former Falcons include College Football hall of famer and former Dallas Cowboy D.D. Lewis, UT basketball All-American Bill Justus, former Vol linebacker Jackie Walker, and four-sport letter winner Ron Widby. Fulton's destiny was almost sealed in 1992 when the Knox Co. School Board voted to close the school, but strong protests by alumni and supporters helped to reverse the decision. The Falcons clinched their first state championship in any sport in 2003 defeating Covington for the class 3A football title. Fulton began their title defense on a rocky note in 2004, losing 2 of their first 4 games, but showed constant improvement throughout the season. The Falcons hit their stride in the playoffs, advancing to their 3^{rd} consecutive BlueCross Bowl. Fulton's 2^{nd} state championship was sewn up after a 34-6 defeat of Greenbrier.

Coach Buck Coatney

Fulton High School's 26-7 win over Austin-East on August 25th was a milestone victory for Head Football Coach Buck Coatney. The Falcons gave Coatney his 100th coaching victory as FHS head coach. This is an amazing feat, considering that when Coatney was hired in 1992, Fulton was slated to be closed. Coatney's job looked to be a temporary one. Interest in football was slipping at the school, as many players moved to other schools due to the proposed closing. The 1992 team suffered through a 1-9 season, but the lone win was an overtime victory over West. The Fulton program improved throughout the early 90s. The Falcons made their first of 13 consecutive playoff appearances under Coatney in 1993. By the year 2000, Fulton had re-established

itself as a football power in the Knoxville area. In 2002, Coatney led the Falcons to their first undefeated regular season since 1974, ending the season at the BlueCross Bowl. Coatney became the first-ever coach in Knoxville to lead his team to back-to-back state football championships in 2003 and 2004.

Coatney's roots are colored maroon and white, as his father John captained Fulton's 1959 team. Coatney was known as a hardnosed linebacker and tight end on the Falcon teams of the late 70s. He was named to the allstate team and the Knoxville Journal defensive player of the year, as he led Fulton to a region championship in 1979. Coatney earned Honorable-Mention All-American honors at Furman University. He began his coaching career at Furman as a graduate assistant. After leaving Furman, Coatney spent two years as an assistant coach at Middlesburg High School in Florida. He returned to Fulton in 1987, where he served as Defensive Coordinator. He was named Fulton's 11th head coach in 1992. Coatney is the only football coach to win three consecutive KFL/PrepXtra Coach of the year honors (2002-2004). For his work in 2004, Coatney was named state coach of the year by the Tennessee Sportswriters Association, and the Tennessee Titans.

Last Week- FHS 22 Tyner 7

Fulton improved its record to 5-0 for the first time since 2002 as they defeated class 2A power Chattanooga Tyner 22-7 last week at Bob Black Field. The homecoming crowd barely got into their seats before the Falcons scored their first touchdown. Fulton recovered an onside kick on the opening kickoff, and scored two plays later on a 40-yard run by Dennis Rogan. Rogan rushed for 145 yards and two TDs in the game. Tyner answered Fulton's score to take a 7-6 lead on a 15-yard inside reverse run by John Taylor. Fulton squandered two other scoring opportunities in the first half before driving 47 yards in three plays for the final score of the half. QB Jack Wagner hit Dennis Freeney in the end zone on the 36-yard scoring toss to give the Falcons a 12-7 halftime advantage. Fulton increased its lead to 20-7 on an impressive 14-play, 82-yard drive in the 3rd quarter. Rogan finished the drive with a 1-yard plunge. Tawaud Mattress ended the scoring for Fulton as the tackled the Tyner punter in the end zone for a safety. Tyner on the game only converted 1 of 7 4th down conversions on the game. Bubba Stokes was a standout on the Fulton defense, recording 16 tackles.

Falcons To Honor Kristi Walker

The Futon High Family lost both a family member and a friend this spring with the passing of Kristi Black Walker. Kristi, the daughter of Coach Bob Black and Sister of Coach Rob Black, passed away on May 4, 2006 after a battle with cancer. Kristi was a 1989 graduate of Fulton, and was a member of the cheerleading squad. She was an employee of Knox Co. schools in the employee benefits department. Kristi was one of Fulton's most passionate fans. She was the heart of the Falcon cheering section, often bringing signs and cheering at the top of her lungs. Kristi also was a fixture on the coacht.com message boards, keeping opposing fans in check as screen name kwalker4. To honor her memory, the Fulton football team will have a special logo on the backs of their helmets featuring the initials "KW." Additionally, Coach Coatney announced that Fulton's new black jersevs are dedicated to Kristi. Fulton vs. Scott- The Series

Fulton and Scott High meet for the 12th time tonight in Huntsville. Fulton leads the all-time series 8-3, and leads in the games played at Scott 4-1. The series dates back to 1993 and has featured many high and low points for each school. The 1993 meeting saw Scott hold the Falcons with a goal-line stand as time expired to win 21-14. The next year, the Highlanders rained on Fulton's homecoming with an impressive 14-0 victory in Knoxville. The most exciting meeting in the series came in 1997 when Fulton drove the length of the field in the final seconds for a late touchdown. The Falcons chose to go for the two-point conversion to win the game, and Tyson Porter's conversion run kept the Falcon's playoff hopes alive with the 22-21 victory. A region championship was on the line in 1999 when Scott, led by QB Scott Brummett, upset the Falcons 34-14 at Bob Black Field. Fulton returned the favor in 2001, defeating Scott 76-0, the most points scored by the Falcons in school history. Fulton currently holds a 6 game winning streak in the series. Fulton defeated Scott last year in Knoxville 56-24.

Last Year

Homecoming 2005 was a happy one for the Fulton Falcons as they rolled to a 56-24 region 2-3A victory over the Scott Highlanders at Bob Black Field. Dennis Rogan was the offensive star for the Falcons recording a career-best 301 yards rushing and five touchdowns. Rogan's first touchdown of the game came on a 25-yard scamper on the Falcons' first offensive play. Freshman QB Jock Stinson connected on two touchdown passes in the game to Chris Pitchford. Stinson completed 9 of 16 passes for a career-high 197 yards. Fulton led 30-6 at the half before enduring a barrage by Scott RB Wesley Smith. Smith rushed for a Scott High record 329 yards and four touchdowns. Rogan concluded the scoring on a 71-yard TD gallop in the fourth quarter. The win marked the first regional victory for the Falcons in 2005.
